ADVANCED KEYLESS ENTRY SYSTEM

• This system allows you to lock/unlock the doors, open the trunk lid and start the engine without taking the key out.

k While Carrying the Advanced Key...

 Unlock the driver's door by gently grasping and pulling the door handle after the beep sound is heard. The sensor on the back side of the door handle will sense the motion of your hand and unlock the door.

NOTE: If the door handle is pulled too quickly (before door is unlocked), the door may not open. Pull the door handle again to open.

- Unlock all doors by pushing the inner door lock switch after opening the driver's door.
- **Open the trunk** by pushing the trunk request switch.
- Lock all doors by pushing the driver's door or passenger door request switch once.
- Open the front windows and moon roof by pushing the unlock button on the advanced keyless entry transmitter and then pushing again and holding; release to stop.
- Close front windows and moon roof by pushing and holding the driver's door request switch; release to stop.

KEYLESS ENTRY SYSTEM

This system remotely locks and unlocks the doors and the trunk, and opens the power windows and moon roof.

Release Button

- Push to extend key.
- Push & fold to retract key.

Unlock

- Push once to unlock driver's doors.
- Push twice (within three seconds) to unlock all doors.
- Push twice and hold to open front windows and moon roof.

Trunk

• Push and hold to open trunk.

Lock

- Push once to lock all doors.
- Push twice (within five seconds) for horn sound verification that both doors are locked.

Panic Alarm

- Push for one second or more to activate alarm.
- Push Lock, Unlock, Trunk or Panic Alarm to turn alarm off.

STARTING THE ENGINE

While Carrying the Advanced Key...

- **Start the engine** by pushing the START/STOP button, while pushing the clutch pedal (manual transmission) or the brake pedal (automatic transmission).
- Shut the engine OFF by pushing the START/STOP button again.
- Activate Accessories (ACC) by pushing the START/STOP button once without pushing the clutch or brake pedal.
- The key indicator light ----- will show GREEN when the advanced key is detected and the brake pedal is pushed. The engine is ready to start. The indicator flashes RED (for 3 seconds) when the key is not detected or if the advanced keyless transmitter battery is dead. If illuminated RED, the push button start may not start the engine, unless the auxiliary key is used.



NOTE:

Engine Stop

Continuously pushing the START/STOP button while the engine is running will turn the engine OFF. Use only in case of an emergency.

Vehicle Entry/Engine Start

If the advanced key cannot be used due to a malfunction or dead advanced key battery, use the auxiliary key to lock/unlock the doors and to start the engine.

With the Auxiliary Key...

- 1 To start engine, locate the key slot cover on the steering column and remove the cover.
- 2 Insert the auxiliary key into the key slot, then push the START/STOP button with the clutch pedal (M/T) or the brake pedal (A/T) pushed down to start the engine.

ELECTRONICALLY OPERATED DRIVER SEAT CONTROLS

Slide/Tilt Switch

Seat can be moved back and forth, raised, lowered, or tilted with this control.

Recline Switch Push forward or backward to adjust seatback angle.

Lumbar Adjustment

Rotate clockwise to increase support and counterclockwise to decrease support.

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To Program the Driver's Seat Position

- 1 Park vehicle.
- 2 Adjust seat to desired position using the slide/tilt and recline switches.
- **3** While pushing the memory seat SET button, push one of the three programming buttons until a beep is heard. Programming is now complete. Program the remaining two buttons as desired.

NOTE: You can also program one seat position for each advanced key/retractable type key used with the vehicle. See Owner's Manual for programming instructions.

To Move the Seat to a Programmed Position

• With driver's door OPEN and ignition OFF, push and release one of the programmed buttons (1, 2, or 3) when entering the vehicle.

OR

• With driver's door CLOSED and ignition ON, push and hold one of the programmed buttons (1, 2, or 3).

NOTE: Memory seat functions DO NOT operate when driver's door is OPEN and ignition is ON, when driver's door is CLOSED and ignition is OFF, or when the vehicle is in motion.

Fuel Door Release (located on floor next to driver's seat)

To open, pull the remote fuel door release.

NOTE: Fuel requirement 87 Octane.




Fuel Door






WINDSHIELD WIPER/WASHER CONTROL LEVER

AUTO: The rain sensor senses the amount of rainfall and turns the wipers on or off. Rotate ring away from you (clockwise) for less sensitivity and towards you (counterclockwise) for more sensitivity.

NOTE: Vehicles not equipped with AUTO wipers will have INT wipers. Set the lever to INT and choose an interval timing by rotating the ring between fast and slow.

The Sport AT Manual Shift Mode gives you the feel of driving a manual transmission by allowing you to manually shift to control engine rpm and torgue when more control is desired.



Auto-Dimming Mirrors



- Auto-dimming automatically darkens your rearview mirror and both outside door mirrors to reduce headlight glare from the vehicles behind you.
- · Auto-dimming is activated every time the vehicle is started.

NOTE:

• Both door mirrors will appear to have a halo, or ring, around the outer edge of the mirror surface. This is actually the electrical circuitry that allows the mirrors to dim. This is normal operation of the mirrors.

• In addition to the auto-dimming mirror's front light sensor, there is also a rear light sensor (not shown). Do not place or hang any objects over the front or rear mirror light sensors; otherwise, the auto-dimming mirrors will not operate properly.

BLIND SPOT MONITORING (BSM) SYSTEM

The Blind Spot Monitoring (BSM) system is designed to assist the driver by monitoring the blind spots to the rear of the vehicle on both sides.


- If your vehicle speed is 20 mph (32 km/h) or more, the BSM will warn you of vehicles in the detection area by illuminating the BSM warning lights located on the left and right door mirrors.
- If you operate a turn signal in the direction of an illuminated BSM warning light, the system will also warn you with a beep and warning light flash.
- BSM sensors are located under the left and right rear bumper areas. The BSM system may not operate properly if the rear bumper gets too dirty, so keep the rear bumper area clean.

Please refer to your Owner's Manual for complete details.

Turning BSM System Off

To manually turn the BSM system off, push the BSM OFF switch on the dash. The BSM OFF indicator will illuminate in the instrument cluster when the BSM system is off. The BSM system will automatically turn on the next time the vehicle is started.

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NOTE: Do not rely completely on the BSM system and be sure to look over your shoulder before changing lanes:

- The BSM system can assist the driver in confirming the safety of the surroundings, but is not a complete substitute.
- The driver is responsible for ensuring safe lane changes and other maneuvers.
- Always pay attention to the direction in which the vehicle is traveling and the vehicle's surroundings.
- The BSM system does not operate when the vehicle speed is lower than about 20 mph (32 km/h).

PORTABLE AUDIO PLAYER INTEGRATION USING THE AUX JACK

Your vehicle is equipped with an AUX or auxiliary jack that will allow you to play your portable audio player through the vehicle's audio system. Learn the system when parked and do not let it distract you while driving. Refer to the Owner's Manual for additional information.

NOTE: You will need a cable with an 1/8 inch mini stereo plug to connect your portable audio player into the aux jack.


- 1 Locate the AUX jack inside the center console
- 2 Plug 1/8 inch mini stereo plug into the portable audio player and into the AUX jack. Turn portable audio player on.
- 3 Turn the vehicle audio system on.
- Without Navigation System: Push AUX (or CD/AUX) button on audio system OR push MODE button on steering wheel controls until "AUX" is displayed.
 - With Navigation System: Push SOURCE button on audio system, then push AUX1 on screen OR push MODE button on steering wheel controls until "AUX1" is displayed.
- 5 Use the portable audio player controls to play music.

NOTE: Set the volume level on your portable audio player to the highest level before distortion starts. Then adjust the volume in the vehicle using the audio system power/volume control or the steering wheel volume up and down controls.

LOADING A CD Single CD Player

- Insert the CD into the slot, label-side up. The auto loading mechanism will load the CD and begin to play it.

FOLDER SEARCH (during MP3/WMA CD playback)

 To change to the previous folder, push the folder down button (∨), or push the folder up button (∧) to advance to the next folder.

NOTE: If you continue to push and hold the button, the frequency will continue changing without stopping.

• Scan: Push the SCAN button to automatically sample strong stations for seconds each. Push again to cancel.

• Auto Memory Tuning:

Select and hold the AUTO-M on-screen button until beep is heard to store an additional 8 stations on each FM and AM band without disturbing the previously stored stations. This is useful when driving in an area where the local stations are not known. Refer to the Owner's Manual for complete details.

- Preset Channel: Can be used to store 8 AM, 16 FM and 24 SIRIUS® Satellite stations.
 - 1 To set a channel, first select AM, FM1, FM2, SAT1, SAT2 or SAT3.
 - 2 Tune to the desired station.
 - **3** Push the TUNE AUDIO dial.
 - 4 Select and hold any channel preset on-screen button for about two seconds until a beep is heard.
 - Repeat to store other stations.

SETTING YOUR CLOCK

1. Push the **MENU** button.

- **2.** Select the Set Clock tab.
- **3.** Choose a 24-hour display or a 12-hour display.
- 4. Use the + hour and hour tabs to enter the correct hour.
- 5. Use the + min (minutes) and - min to set the correct minutes.
- 6. Exit by pushing the OK tab.

NOTE: Minutes and seconds are adjusted by the GPS; however, it is necessary to adjust hours under the following conditions:

- Driving across different time zones
- Daylight saving time start and end
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

INSERTING THE MAP DISC:





Your navigation system operates using the Map Discs supplied.

- **Disc A** covers most of the Midwest and Western states including Hawaii and Alaska.
- **Disc B** covers some of the Midwest and all of the Eastern states including Puerto Rico.
- Both discs cover all of Canada.

NOTE: If the state your address is in is not displayed when entering a destination, you may have the wrong disc in the navigation system.

- 1 Push LOAD.
- **2** When "Load/Eject" screen appears, select "MAP". Wait for navigation screen to tilt open.
- **3** Remove current Map Disc (if installed) and insert the desired Map Disc, with the printed side facing up, into the lower DVD MAP slot.
- **4** Read the Caution carefully and select the "AGREE" on-screen button.

SELECTING A DESTINATION USING A STREET ADDRESS

You can choose setting a destination using a street address, a point of interest, the nearest restaurants, ATMs, gas stations, hospitals and more.

- 1 Push "MENU" button on navigation face.
- 2 Select "Destination Entry".
- 3 Select "Address".
- 4 Select the "State" or "Province".
 - · Scroll down past the States to find Canadian Provinces.
- 5 Select "OK".
- 6 Select "City".
- 7 Select "Input City Name".
- 8 Use the keyboard to enter the city name.
- 9 Select "Street".
- 10 Use the keyboard to enter the street name.
- 11 Select "House No".
- 12 Use the keyboard to enter the house number, then select "OK".
- **13** When the map appears, select "Destination".
- 14 Select "Guide" or just start driving.

SELECTING A POINT OF INTEREST (POI) NEAR YOUR CURRENT LOCATION

- 1 Push the "MENU" button on the navigation face.
- 2 Select "Destination Entry".
- 3 Select "Point of Interest".
- 4 Select "Nearest".
- **5** Select "Current Position".
- 6 In the QUICK POI screen, select the category of the point of interest you want to find. You can set multiple categories for searching up to five.
- 7 After selecting categories, select "List".
- 8 Search result shows up as a list in "LOCAL POIs" screen. Select the point of interest you want to set as the destination from the list.
- 9 Select "Destination".
- 10 Select "Guide" or just start driving.

NOTE: When entering numbers for a street name, (e.g., 1st Ave.), push "Sym." button to switch to the numeric keyboard.

- **2** Say the number you want dialed. If the number repeated back is correct say, "**Yes**," and the prompt will say it is dialing.
- To receive a call, push condition. To end or reject a call, push confirm the call is ended.
